pending on the cat and its particular mood. A simple length of sting is more often a far better toy.

But we spend time picking out that special toy with the best feathers and brightest colors, even if our cats can't see colors. The shape of the feathered cloth must be considered; does it look like a bird? The length of string and the feel of the stick are important considerations. We convince ourself that the toy will be a great joy and provide hours of entertainment for us—I mean the cat. How dumb must our cat be to think it's real? I wonder if we're just exploiting our cat's natural urge to hunt while we enjoy our natural urge to play.



Thinking through strategies for church growth can be like shopping for a cat toy. We can spend enormous amounts of time on style as a substitute for substance. God forbid that we do church without faith and obedience to Jesus Christ, as God intended, but it can be easier that way. I think this happens all too often. Crowds will gather to play toy religion without obligation. Frequently other churches see that and successfully imitate it for a while. In truth, without Jesus Christ, a Chistian Church really is a social club with few benefits and doomed to failure.

The first step to church growth may be as simple as to stop playing games. Look for the places where style has overwhelmed substance. Examine how the past may hold a death grip on the present congregation and worse, may be keeping younger people from attending at all.

Let the "cat toy religion" gather dust and take steps forward in committed devotion to Jesus Christ with strength and courage. Leaders should lift up the value of Scripture and model the virtue that Christ expects in His children.

Prayer must be second-nature and ceaseless among the people in a Cristian congregation. We are to be a communion of disciples moving deeper into a full life of service and purpose by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. A church should naturally add too and build up the Kingdom of God.

I pray every church that follows Jesus Christ will be a beacon of peace and light in a dark and turbulent world.

So I will go to Orlando and present. God help me to provide substance not style. May the Lord grant me wisdom. May the clergy I talk with have compassion. Amen

### **Important Dates for May 2024:**

Christ's ascension into heaven is celebrated 40 days after Easter on Ascension Day. This year Ascension Day is Thursday, May 9<sup>th</sup>.

Because it is 40 days after Easter Sunday, Ascension Day is always on a Thursday. Many churches recognize this holy day on the following Sunday, which is May 12<sup>th</sup> this year.

Pentecost Sunday, also known as the birthday of the Christian Church, is May 19<sup>th</sup> in 2024.
