# **Honoring our Pastors**

Being a pastor is an all-consuming calling in life, but the position of pastor in a church body is temporary. Sooner or later pastors must move on and entrust the fellowship they serve to someone else's care.

Over our two-hundred years of history, a long line of clergy has overseen the Danby Community Church, from Reverend Samuel Parker in 1807 to me in 2024.

Inevitably, after three generations no one alive will have met you, and as your name goes into history few will know anything about you. That's the reality of this world. This is no excuse to not preserve the memory of God's servants as best we can. We should keep records of people and events. After all, they have made us who we are.

Several weeks ago the son of Reverend DeForest Koontz contacted me about the lack of recognition of his father, a former Danby Federated pastor who has recently passed. Reverend Koontz was omitted from a list of pastors that were acknowledged during our 200th Anniversary events. Upon searching through our historic records, it became apparent that we have lost track of his service as well as other pastors.

While researching existing records, we found that the documentation for the years between 1966 and 1974 is very sparse. Talking to several people who remembered those times didn't reveal much more than vague memories. From what we could reconstruct, the turbulent era of the Vietnam War negatively impacted our church and community.

From 1966 to 1973 we saw five different pastors. Reverend George Clarkson left the pulpit in 1966, followed by Eugene Durham, Reverend DeForest Koontz, Reverend Glen R. Stewart and Reverend Jimmy Miller, Jr. Both Reverend DeForest Koontz and Reverend Glen R. Stewart served three years each, but were not listed in our clergy records. This oversight is regrettable and is hereby corrected. They will be remembered, as they deserve to be, in our history.

## **Spiritual Development Update**

### **Important Dates for July 2024:**

We are in the season of Ordinary Time (from the Latin "ordinal" meaning counted), which extends from the day after Pentecost through the Saturday before Advent. Traditionally, the Church emphasizes Jesus' teachings on the Kingdom of God during this season.

#### **Small Groups:**

The Sunday morning group is on break from June through August. We expect to reconvene in September.

**Tuesday Evenings at 7 pm,** Pastor Ed leads a study of John Kimball's "Low Hanging Fruit". Kimball offers practical advice on how to prepare for sharing our faith and how to build redemptive relationships.

**The Wednesday night Praise and Fellowship** gathers at 7 pm with the praise team. After worship, we have a time of fellowship and prayer.

**The Thursday evening Bible Study** begins at 7 pm. Pastor Ed is leading a study on the Gospel of Matthew.

**The Friday afternoon Women's Bible Study** is meeting monthly during the summer at individuals' homes. Dates and locations will be announced at church. The group is studying the book "A Layman Looks at the Lord's Prayer" by W. Phillip Keller. Keller also wrote "A Shepherd Looks at Psalm 23" and "Lessons from a Sheepdog," which they've studied in previous years.

**Nursery:** The nursery is available every Sunday for babies and children through age five.

<u>Children's Church:</u> After the first set of worship music on Sundays, children ages 6 through 10 (about 5<sup>th</sup> grade) are welcome to attend Children's Church.

- **In-person Prayer** is Mondays from 5:00 5:30 PM. Gather with others in the sanctuary for a dedicated time of intercession to our Lord


## Summer Reading and the Season of Growth By Sheila Enstine

During the long period between Pentecost Sunday and the Sunday before Advent, the Christian Church observes the season of Ordinary Time. This is a season of spiritual growth that coincides with the natural season of plant growth.

Here in the northeast, we luxuriate in the lush green of a multitude of flora and fauna. This is possible due to amble rain and sun and fertile soil.

Imagine your soul producing a spiritual crop as lush and vigorous as the plant world. That is the hope and possibility of the Church for all faithful believers during Ordinary Time.

To accomplish this spiritual growth, the Church has traditionally focused on the fertile soil of Jesus' teaching about his Kingdom, with an emphasis on Jesus' parables of the Kingdom. You will find the parables in the three synoptic Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke.



<sup>&</sup>quot;The Kingdom of heaven is like a treasure hidden in a field..." (Matt. 13:44).

Set aside time this summer—maybe in a lawn chair with a glass of lemonade or iced tea—and read through the parables. The following is a much abbreviated list of scripture references for a few of the parables. Some are found in only one Gospel and some parables have cross references in the other Gospel accounts. You'll find that each rendering gives a different slant to the meaning of the story. Always pray before reading, asking the Holy Spirit to be your Guide and Teacher, so that you might have a greater understanding of what the parables are telling you about God, about people, about God's relationship with people, and about yourself.

**Spiritual Development.** The church is in the season of Ordinary Time – the longest of the liturgical year. Ordinary doesn't mean routine, it refers to 'ordinal numbers' (1, 2, 3...) and the way weeks are counted. It is centered on Jesus's parables of His coming Kingdom. The liturgical color is green signifying new growth.
